

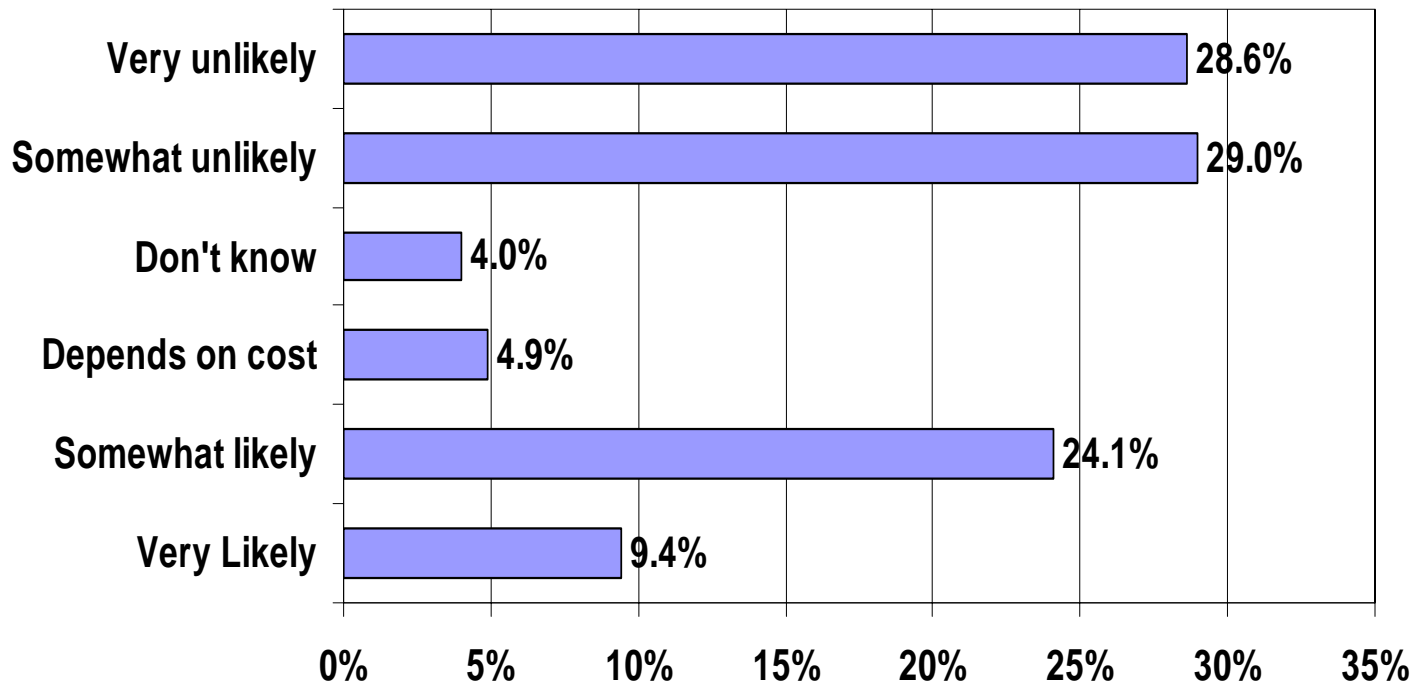


# Renewable Energy Survey Results

1998 - 2002

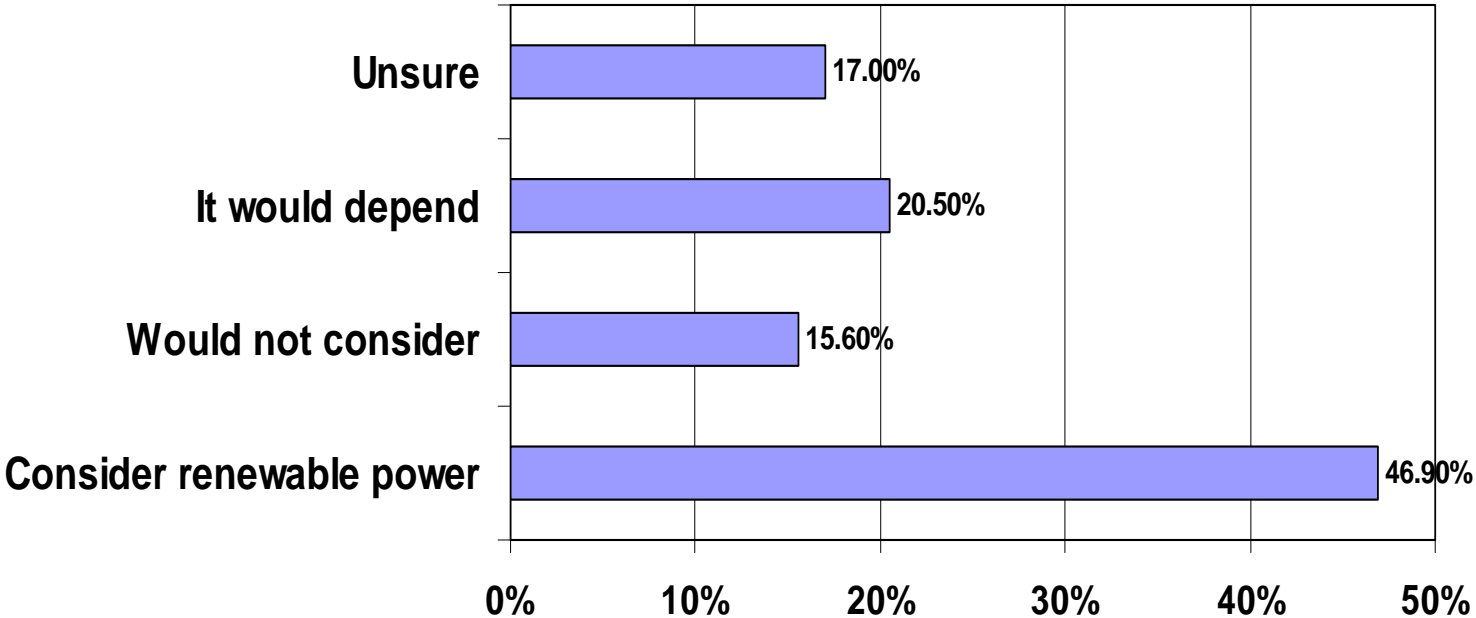
## December 1999 Commercial Customer

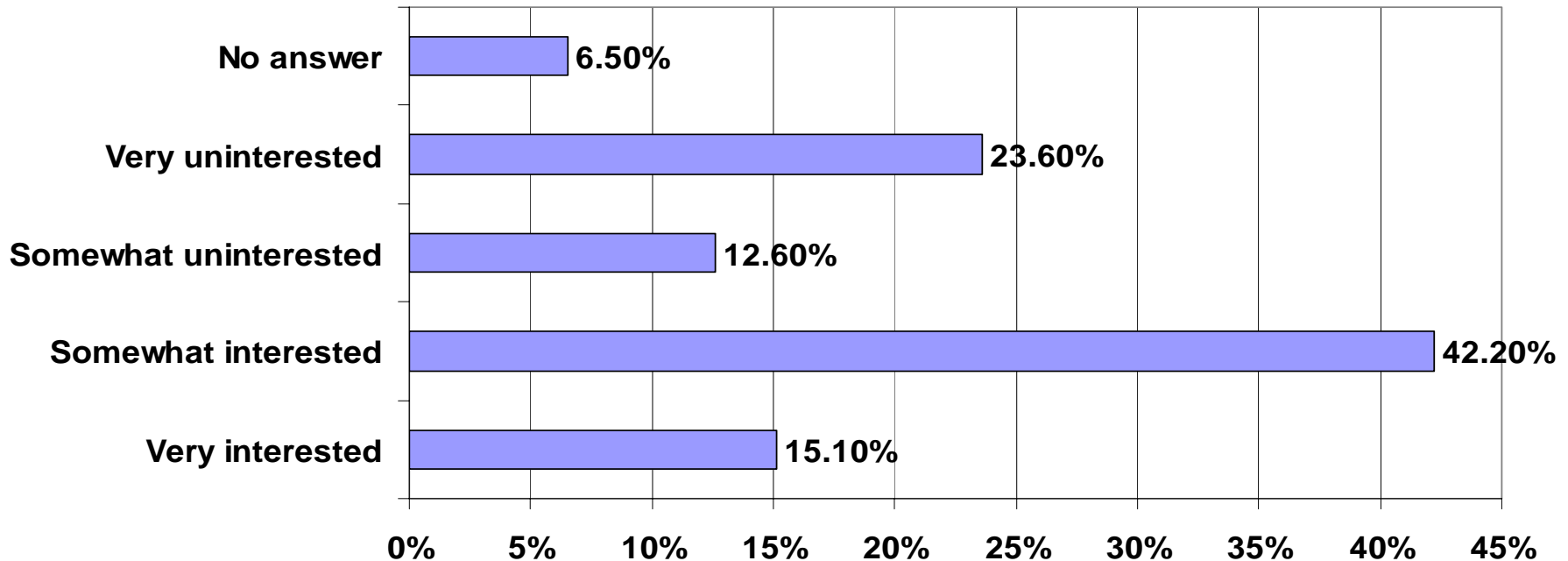
# December 2000 Commercial Customers

If it were available, would you ever consider purchase of at least some renewable power, sometimes called "green power?"



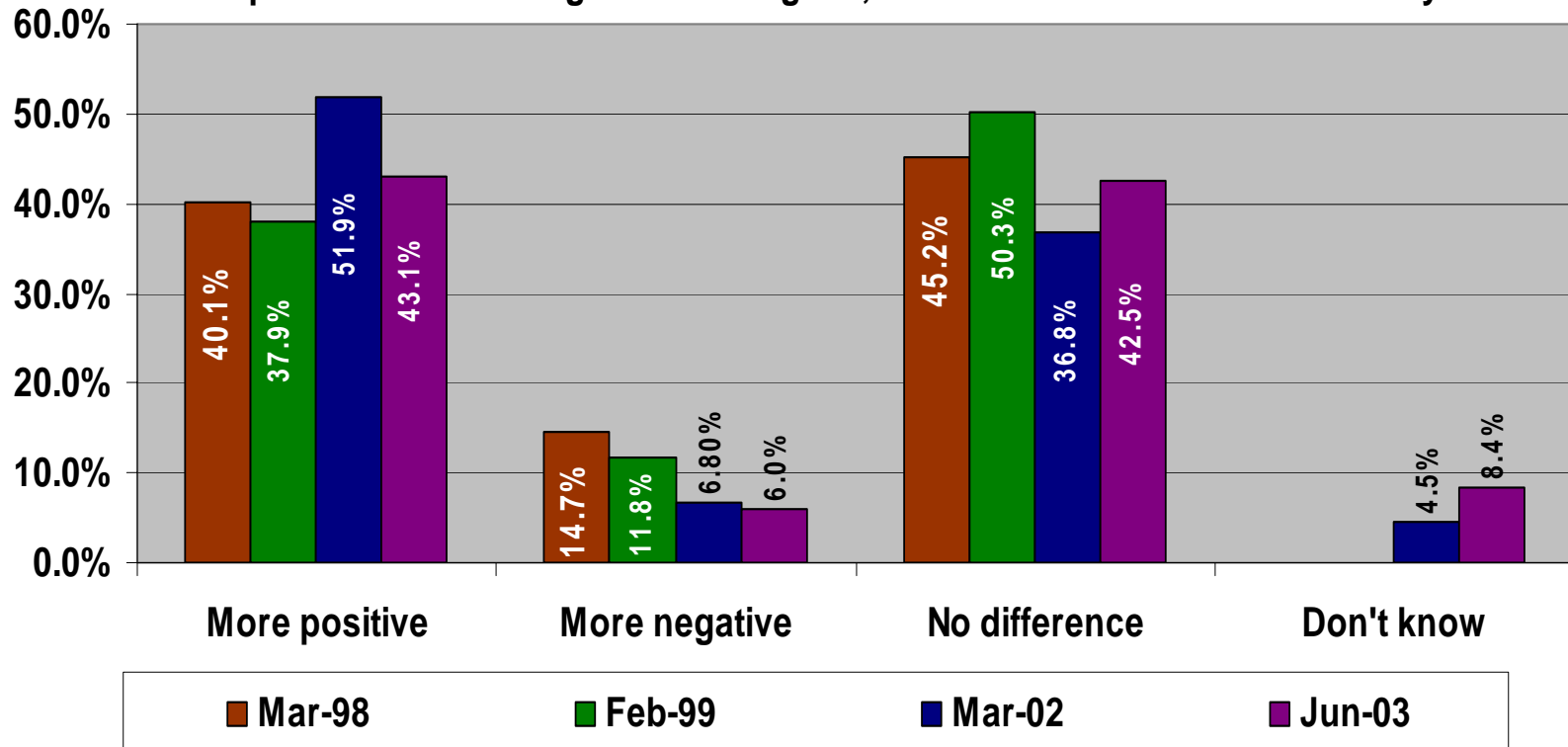
## January 2002 Commercial Customers

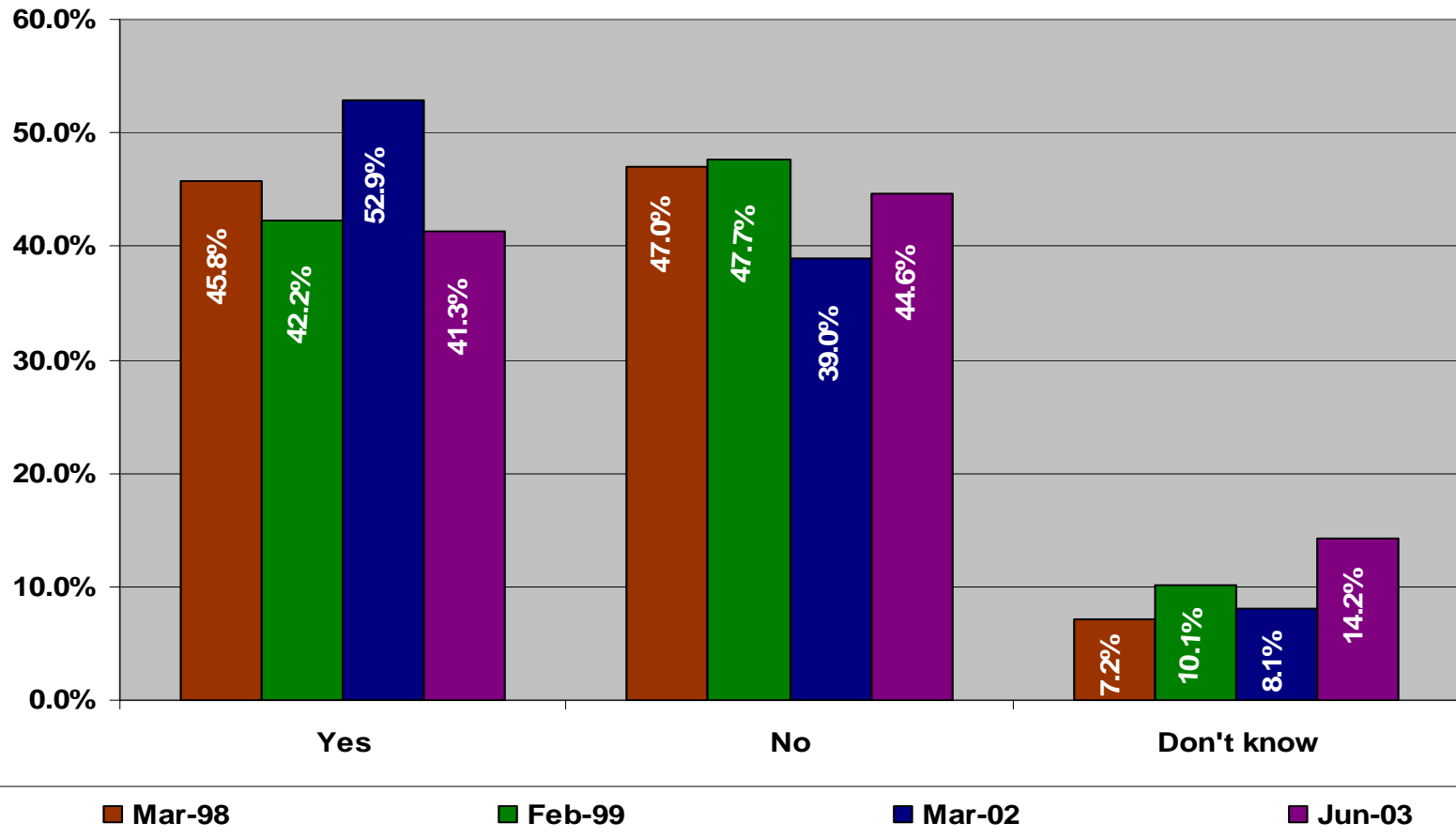
## Residential

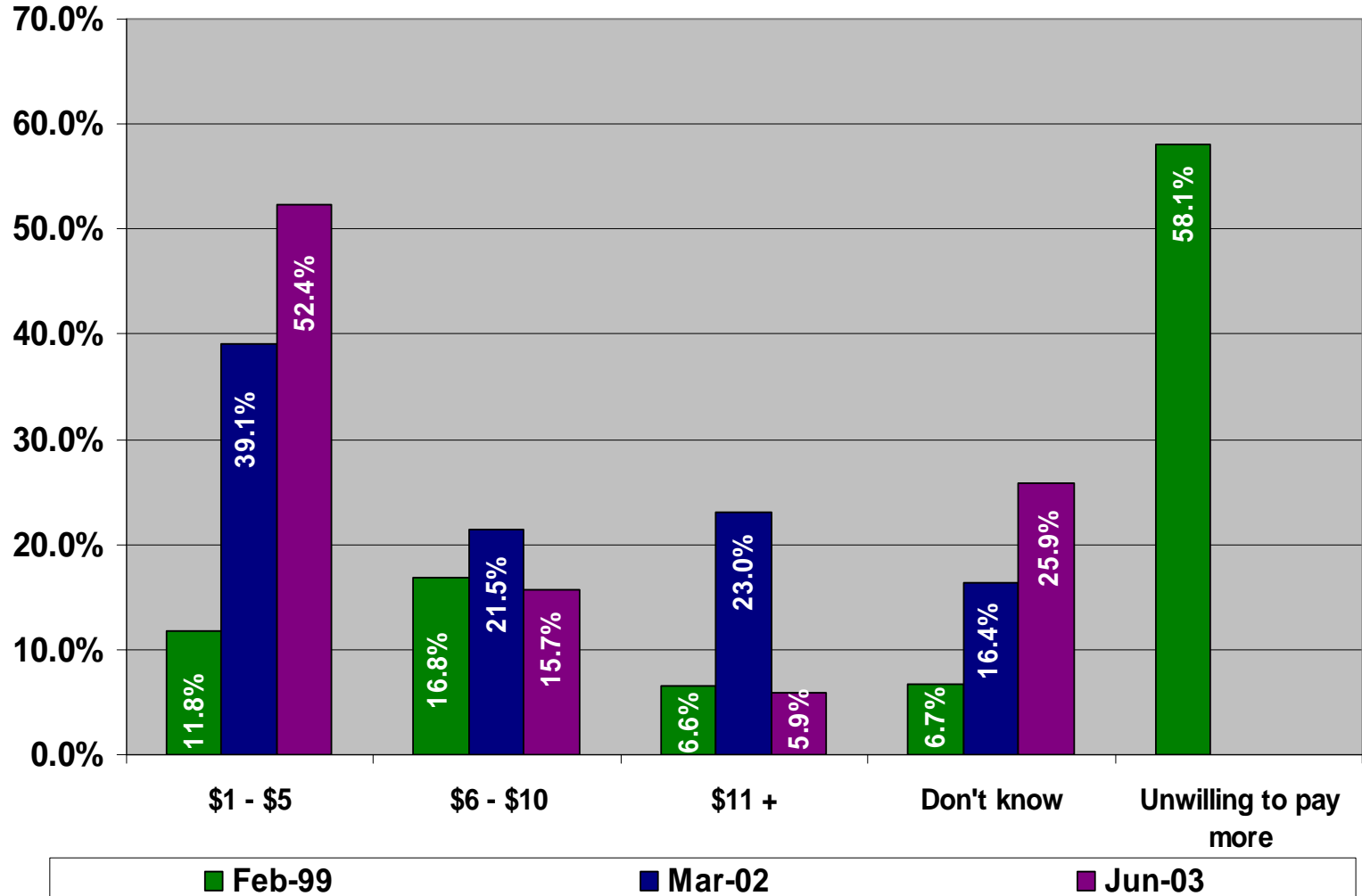
# Residential
