Eklutna public meetings held

The owners of the Eklutna Hydroelectric Project, Chugach, Matanuska Electric Association, and the Municipality of Anchorage, held six public meetings in January on the Draft Fish & Wildlife Program. The draft program is part of the agreement signed when the project was purchased in the 1990s, requiring the project owners to first study and then propose a plan to mitigate, protect, and enhance fish and wildlife impacted by the project.

The six public meetings were held in Palmer, Eagle River, and Anchorage. The draft program is open for public comment until February 19. The governor makes the final decision on what program will be implemented, and a
