In an effort to gauge member opinions of sustainability and community solar, Chugach Electric Association recently polled more than 700 members via telephone and email. The survey, conducted in August, showed a high level of support for both.

When asked how important it is for Chugach to make decisions with consideration of financial, environmental, and social factors, as opposed to primarily financial factors, 81 percent of members surveyed said it was very important or somewhat important. Of those surveyed, 63 percent said they favor Chugach installing a community solar project. {1095287}

In February, the Chugach Board of Directors passed a resolution establishing sustainability as a business management philosophy for the member-owned cooperative. Sustainability, also known as the Triple Bottom Line, is a business philosophy measuring the performance of an organization based on financial, environmental, and community impacts.

Other highlights of the member survey include:

- 56 percent are willing to pay more per month for electricity from renewable resources;
- 46 percent said energy affordability is the most important sustainability factor for Chugach to consider;
- 48 percent said providing internships for high school


Chugach currently generates about three-fourths of its power from natural gas, with the balance coming from hydroelectric and wind generation. When asked what type of future generation members would like to see more or less of in the future, members responded:

- 85 percent want more energy efficiency and conservation programs;
- 82 percent want the most cost-effective generation source;
- 74 percent want more solar generation;
- · 72 percent would like to see more use of wind;
- 70 percent want more use of hydroelectric generation; and
- 69 percent want more natural gas in the mix

Chugach is designing a community solar project that would allow participating members to offset some of their electric usage with solar power. More information will be available in the coming months. In addition to the sustainability survey, Chugach annually surveys its members for their attitudes on reliability, value, and customer service.

Here are a few thoughts from our members:



Merry, bright and efficient holiday lighting -

Decking the halls doesn't have to take a toll on your energy bill. Keep you holiday lighting merry, bright and energy efficient with LED light strands.

- · Consider replacing older light strands with new ENERGY STAR LED lights. LED strands are 75 percent more efficient and last 10 times longer than the standard bulbs.
- You can get the look of cozy lighting with LEDs. Just look for "warm white" on the label.



- Unlike older light strands, LED lights give off virtually no heat, making them safer for kids and pets (and reindeer).
- Save energy by setting a time for outdoor lighting and decoration. Program the timer so the lights turn on in the evening and turn off later

at night when you typically go to sleep.

Rate changes

The Regulatory Commission of Alaska approved Chugach's Simplified Rate Filing based on the June 30, 2017 test year. As a result of the approval, retail demand and energy rates increased 1.9 percent for rates effective November 1, 2017. Because the rate change is only applied to demand and energy components, the impact on a total customer bill will be lower than 1.9 percent. For a residential customer using 600 kWh, the monthly bill will increase from \$118.39 to \$119.75, or about 1.1 percent.
