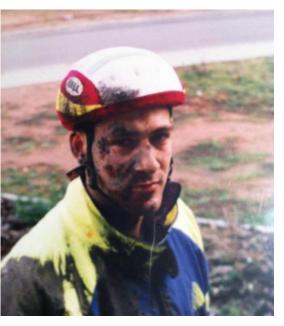

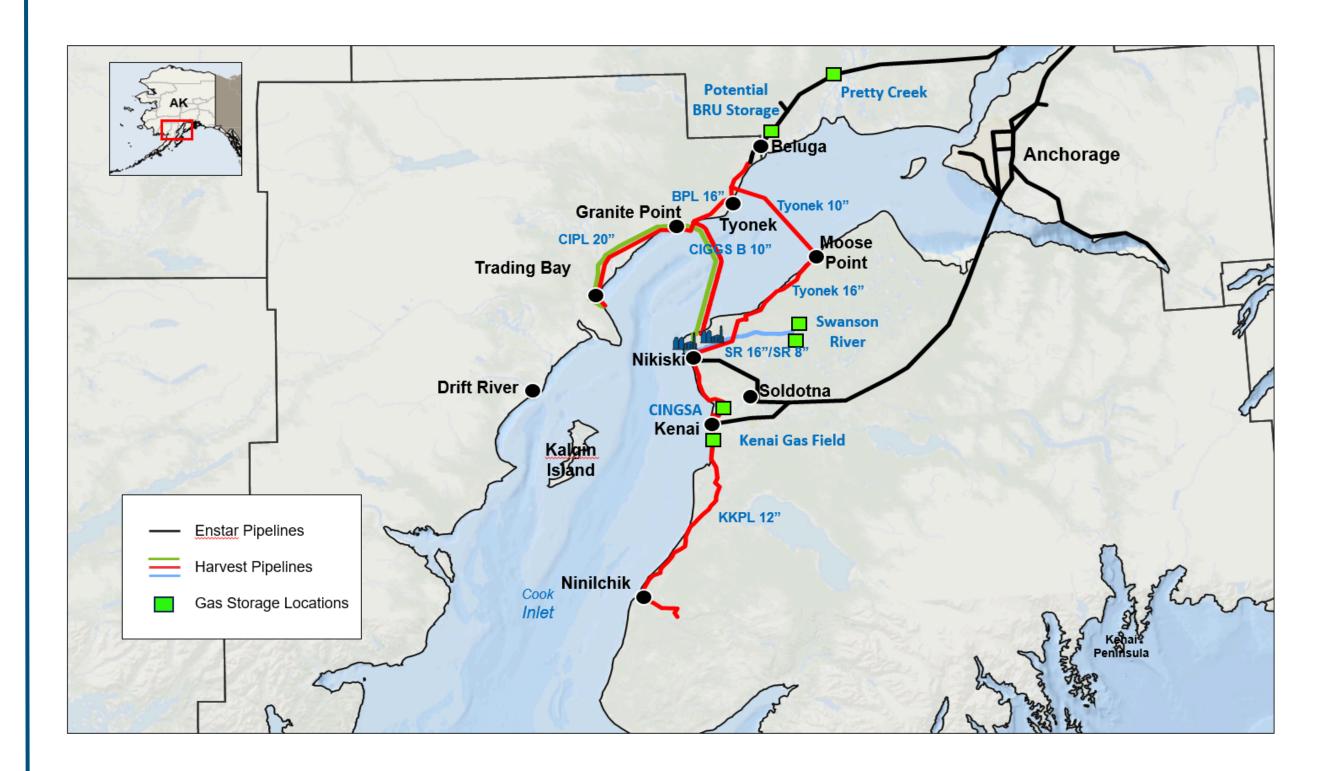


Energy Factoid: Cook Inlet Pipelines

Cook Inlet Pipeline & Storage Network



- > 350 miles of gathering pipelines
 for moving oil, water & natural gas
- ENSTAR & Harvest are primary
 pipeline providers
- The pipeline system has the ability to move gas between the east and west sides of Cook Inlet
- Additional gas storage will be critical to managing future gas supply needs including LNG imports
- Chugach's BRU storage opportunity is well positioned to add significant value to expanding as storage

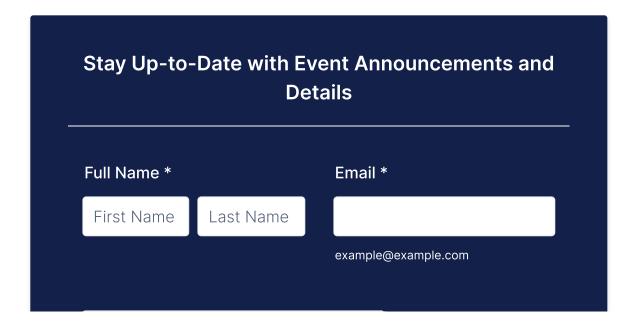

The form of this communication is at the discretion of the Association Board. The Association Board shall be provided access to all written or visual materials provided to, or prepared by, the Management Committee, its subcommittees, employees, agents, consultants or contractors, subject to any applicable confidentiality agreement or requirements.
