## **2020 Voting Information**

#### Introduction

Chugach is more than a utility – it is a member-owned cooperative. As a cooperative, Chugach is guided by a seven-member board of directors elected by and from the membership. Directors are elected to staggered 4-year terms in conjunction with the annual meeting each spring.

Four candidates are running for the two available seats on the board in the 2020 election. This pamphlet contains voting instructions, information on each candidate, and a director attendance and voting record.

You must be a member of Chugach by April 22, 2020 (date of record as set by the Board), to be eligible to vote in the 2020 election. Chugach has moved to a paperless election. Please update your email with Chugach to receive important election materials and voting instructions. Paper ballots and election materials are available upon request.

#### **SPECIAL NOTE for 2020 Membership Meeting:**

In order to comply with safety and health concerns and the emergency orders due to the Coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic, the 2020 Chugach Annual Meeting will be conducted through a virtual platform on Monday, June 15 beginning at 5:30 pm. To participate, sign up for the meeting on the Chugach website beginning May 1, 2020.

Chugach's bylaws allow the annual election to take place without a formal meeting, and members will be offered the opportunity to participate in the election, voting online from May 15 to June 15 or via a paper ballot from May 15 to June 12. There will be no in-person voting for the 2020 Chugach election.

## Ways to vote

#### **Electronic voting:**

 An email will be sent to you with your voting instructions on May 15. If you don't see it, check your spam filter before contacting the elections contractor. *Electronic* voting will close at 4 p.m., Monday, June 15.

#### Paper ballot voting:

- By US Mail in the postage-paid return envelope. Ballot envelopes must be received in the post office box by noon, Friday, June 12.
- In the secure drop box at Chugach, 5601 Electron Drive or BDO USA, LLC at 3601 C Street, Suite 600.
   Ballot envelopes must be in secure drop box by noon, Friday, June 12.

A ballot envelope must contain a member number and the appropriate signature for that membership.

#### (No) In-person voting:

 Due to the restrictions and emergency orders related to the Coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic, Chugach will not have in-person voting for the 2020 election. Chugach's bylaws allow the annual election to take place without a formal meeting, and members will be offered the opportunity to participate in the election, voting online from May 15 to June 15 or via a paper ballot from May 15 to June 12.

#### Candidate Statements

The candidates are solely responsible for the content of their statements. Publication of the candidates' statements does not imply endorsement by Chugach Electric Association, Inc. of any candidate or specific group. For candidates referencing endorsements by a specific group, Chugach policy requires candidates to maintain on file in the Corporate Communications office, the name of the chairman or president, title, and the address and telephone number at which the group may be contacted.

Article III, Section 9 of the Chugach Bylaws calls for candidate statements to specify whether the candidate is:

- (i) A member, officer, director or employee of any union local currently acting as a bargaining agent for Association employees.
- (ii) A person who has within the last two years had a financial interest in a bid, proposal, project or contract with Chugach.
- (iii) A spouse, child, brother, sister, parent, stepparent, stepchild or stepsibling of: a) any person included in subparagraph (i) or (ii) above or b) an employee of the Association.
- (iv) A person running as an authorized representative of a non-natural entity in accordance with Article IV, Section 3(b).

Candidates' responses to these requirements are noted in the area marked "Declarations."

#### **Candidate Statement**

I have been a Chugach Electric Association member for 31 years and would be honored to serve on the Board of Directors. Major challenges facing the association include the pending acquisition of ML&P, the movement to integrate the Railbelt utilities, increasing conversion to renewable power generation resources, and the desire to keep electrical rates as low as possible.

As an Anchorage small-business owner since 1995, I have the technical, business management, and practical problem-solving skills that would benefit my role as a Director on the Board. I am a practical private sector leader and have no personal agenda in seeking a Board seat. My background as an environmental consultant in Alaska since 1989, and track record of tangible accomplishments, enables me to bring a unique perspective to the Board. Now semi-retired, I would be excited to apply my energies to providing governance, supporting the CEA executive team, and meeting the challenges facing our utility.

As a CEA Board Director, I pledge the following if elected:

- · Be accountable and listen to fellow members;
- Strive to minimize electrical rate increases, while maintaining reliability and infrastructure, and retaining quality employees;
- Support system-wide integration of Railbelt utilities;
- Support transition to renewable resources where economically practical.

#### **Candidate Statement**

We are facing new challenges. In times of uncertainty, we should not have to worry about our electric utility service remaining a stable and sustainable part of our life and our economy. As a lifelong Alaskan with extensive utility experience, I ask for your vote to protect that stability.

The acquisition of ML&P has been more complex than expected. The economic impact of the pandemic won't be fully understood for months or years to come. The Swan Lake fire last summer exposed vulnerability in the transmission line from Bradley Lake. In this rapidly changing landscape, Chugach must examine its policies and plans including those for efficiently integrating renewables and working with the other railbelt utilities.

I previously served on the Chugach Board from 2003-2005. For ten years after that I served as a Public Advocate before the Regulatory Commission of Alaska. There I argued for fair, reasonable rates, and for reliable service, not only for electricity but for other utility services like water, sewer, and trash as well.

If elected, I promise to put consumers first. My family has four generations of Alaskans depending on Chugach. Chugach's purpose is to provide reliable, low cost power, and that is my priority.
