In recognition of the significant impact the Coronavirus is having on our community, Chugach is temporarily suspending service disconnects for non-payment for members having a financial hardship associated with the COVID-19. Chugach is urging members who are having difficulty making payments due to financial hardships caused by the Coronavirus pandemic to contact our credit department at (907) 563-5060. The temporary moratorium on disconnections does not relieve a member's payment obligation to Chugach.

Chugach is taking several steps to keep employees safe and healthy including work-from-home, staggered shifts, alternate start times, and implementing the numerous hygiene protocols set out by the CDC. We will continue to follow state and local mandates and will make decisions on opening our lobby and other related activities based on those policies.
