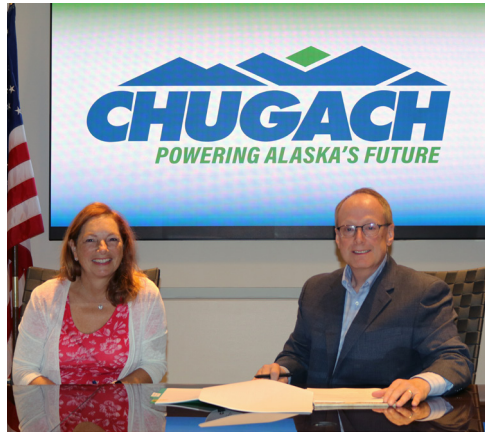


## Board selects Arthur Miller as new Chugach CEO

# IBEW joins EV charging network

Chugach joined members of IBEW Local 1547 and other dignitaries for the ribbon cutting in June of a new electric vehicle (EV) charging station at the union's Denali Street office.

The charging station is the latest addition to the utility's EV charging station incentive program designed to help promote the use of electric vehicles and build an EV charging corridor in the Railbelt. The incentive program offers members bill credits ranging from \$200 to \$5,000 to help defer costs of installing an EV charging station.



The IBEW has also incorporated the Electric Vehicle Infrastructure Training Program into its curriculum which trains electricians in how to work on EV infrastructure.
