

# Light up your holidays >>> efficiently with LED lights

LED holiday lights made their debut in the late '90s. LED is short for a light-emitting diode, which produces light when voltage is applied to a semiconductor diode. Over the years, LEDs have gained popularity and are as easy to find in stores as incandescent lights. {192788}

Consumers have found many

benefits to using LEDs including variety, safety, energy savings, and longevity. The color, bulb shape selection, and brightness of LEDs has improved over the years. LEDs are available with the warm glow you've become accustomed to with incandescent lights.

While LEDs may cost more to purchase than incandescent lights, the investment is quickly recovered

due to the low electric use and the estimated life of the bulbs.

A tree lit for 12 hours a day with 500 mini-incandescent lights cost about \$15 a month. The same tree, with mini-LED lights, will cost less than \$3 a month. LEDs are also estimated to last ten times longer than incandescent bulbs, so you won't have to purchase new lights every year or two.
