

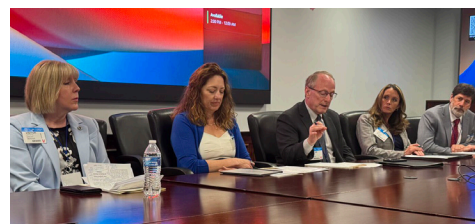
Federal officials hear from Chugach and other Alaska utilities

Chugach staff joined representatives from several Alaska utilities for the annual Alaska Power Association Federal Legislative Conference in Washington, D.C.

During the week of June 2, Chief Executive Officer Arthur Miller and Sr. Manager, Government Affairs Trish Baker were part of the delegation meeting with federal officials to discuss issues important to electric utilities in Alaska. The group met with Sen. Lisa Murkowski, Sen.

Dan Sullivan, and Rep. Nick Begich, as well as officials in the Department of Energy, the Rural Utilities Service, the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission, and the Congressional Western Caucus to discuss energy tax credits, project development, and the unique needs of Alaska's isolated electric grids.

The conference is an excellent opportunity for Chugach and others to tell Alaska's story directly to decision-makers in Washington, D.C.
