There were 284 members who registered at the meeting and an estimated 400 in attendance overall.

Chugach members reelected Rachel Morse and elected Sisi Cooper in this year's election. Cooper previously served on the board of directors from 2012-18.

In the 2022 election, 10,677 members of record—or 11.8%—cast ballots. Of the members who voted, 10,383 voted electronically, 195 used mail-in paper ballots, and 99 voted in person
