## Joint project would bolster much-needed Southcentral gas supply

Chugach is working with Harvest Alaska (Harvest) and Marathon Petroleum Company (Marathon) to bolster Southcentral Alaska's energy supply and bring liquefied natural gas to the region. On Feb. 6, it was announced that Harvest is in the process of acquiring and redeveloping the existing Kenai LNG Terminal, currently owned by Marathon.

The project would repurpose existing assets to enable timely delivery of natural gas supplies to Southcentral as early as 2026. Chugach is in discussions with Harvest to utilize the Kenai facility to bring in the gas which Chugach needs by April 1, 2028. Back in 2022, Hilcorp

Alaska announced it would not be extending existing gas contracts beyond current expiration dates. For Chugach, that date is March 31, 2028.

Chugach gets 40% of its gas from the Hilcorp contract and 60% from its two-thirds working interest ownership of the Beluga River Unit gas field. The utilities who serve Alaskans along the Railbelt have been working to find a project that can provide natural gas when needed for each entity. The project is the first proposal that meets Chugach's 2028 timeline. Under the scenario, the Harvest facility would be used for the imports and Chugach and other customers of the project would source their gas from the



world markets. Harvest is progressing the front-end engineering and design study, and more information will be known about costs and other factors when that is complete.

Voting in the annual election will begin on April 30, with members choosing one candidate to serve on the Chugach Board of Directors. Members can also expect any proposed bylaw amendments to be on the 2025 election ballot.




## MyAccount simplifies energy management
