

Voting open in Chugach election – Cast your ballot by May 29

Chugach members are encouraged to vote in the 2026 annual election. Members will choose from four candidates running for two seats on the Chugach Board of Directors. There are also two proposed bylaw amendments on the ballot.

One proposal amends both the Bylaws and the Articles of Incorporation to replace the current fixed, one-time membership fee with a provision that allows the Board of Directors to set and adjust the membership fee as needed. This only impacts future members. The second

amends grammar, removes sections previously repealed, and other non-substantive revisions in the Bylaws.

Information on candidates and the bylaw proposals is available on Chugach's Annual Meeting and Election page at www.chugachelectric.com/annual-meeting. Voting runs from April 29 to May 29.

Watch for weekly voting emails until May 27 and add noreply@directvote.net to your approved sender list to make sure you receive important election communications.

You can also vote via the Chugach website using the unique voting credentials you'll receive in the mail. Electronic voting closes at 1 p.m. on May 29. Paper ballots are due by noon on May 28.

Chugach's election contractor, Survey & Ballot, can assist members who have not received the voting email or wish to receive a paper ballot. Call (866) 909-3549 or email support@directvote.net. Voting results will be announced at the annual meeting on May 29 at ChangePoint Alaska. The meeting begins at 4 p.m.

Members who vote in the Chugach election will be entered to win one free year of electricity (up to 10,000 kWh valued at the residential rate). Two winners will be announced at the annual meeting. {141023880}

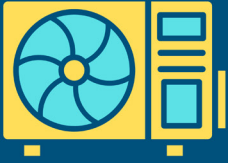
Annual Meeting & Member Appreciation Event planned for May 29

Discover savings by driving electric

With gasoline prices remaining high, electric vehicles (EVs) are an increasingly attractive option for Alaska drivers. Chugach offers a calculator that compares the cost of fueling a gasoline vehicle to charging an EV at home. For example, at \$4.50 per gallon, driving an EV costs less than half as much as a comparable gasoline vehicle. If you drive 10,000 miles a year, that is about \$1,000 savings each year.

EVs also are less expensive to maintain and can save about \$2,000 over three years due to no oil changes, and fewer wear items such as brakes due to regenerative braking systems. When combined with the \$3,000 of fuel savings, an EV could save about \$5,000 over three years for the average Chugach member.

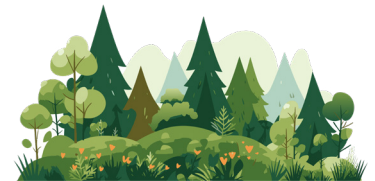
