Chugach advances community solar project

Chugach expects to have Alaska's first community solar project, a four-acre, 500-kilowatt solar array, operational next year. Interested Chugach members will be able subscribe to community solar and pay a share of the project cost and receive an equal share of the energy output on their monthly electric bill. The project will be located next to Chugach's Retherford Substation on F. 94th Avenue next to the



railroad tracks about a half mile south of the Dimond Center. Members may voluntarily subscribe to pay for 1 to 20 solar panels. After a one-year minimum subscription, members may continue or end their subscription at any time.

The project is expected to start producing power in summer of 2025. Chugach is currently soliciting proposals for the design and construction of the solar facility. The cost of subscriptions and estimated energy generation will be announced after proposals are received.

Chugach crews work to maintain reliability

Maintaining a safe and reliable electrical system requires ongoing investment of time and resources in our facilities and infrastructure.

To do this work, Chugach employees frequently need to be able to access equipment on private property for inspection, maintenance, and outage restoration. For planned maintenance work, Chugach employees will first attempt to notify property owners by a knock on the door, a door hanger, or by telephone. During outages, personnel will likely immediately begin work on restoration and may not preemptively announce their presence.


